Regulations for B.Sc. Nursing (Four-year Course) (Semester System) (effective from the session 2022-23):

1. The duration of the course for the degree of B.Sc. (Nursing) (Semester System) including Compulsory Internship shall be four years and as per syllabus, the Internship is only for last semester i.e. VIII semester.
2. The examination for each semester shall ordinarily be held in the month of November/December and April/May on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
3. The minimum age for admission shall be 17 years on 31st December of the year in which admission is sought. The minimum age limit for admission shall be 35 years.
- 3.1 Minimum Educational Qualification:
 - (a) Candidates with Science who have passed the qualifying 12th standard examination (10+2) and must have obtained a minimum of 45% marks in Physics, Chemistry and Biology taken together and passed in English individually.
 - (b) Candidates are also eligible from State Open School recognized by State Government and National Institute of Open School (NIOS) recognized by Central Government having Science subjects and English only.
- 3.2. Colour blind candidates are eligible provided that colour corrective contact lens and spectacles are worn by such candidates.

Computation of CGPA

CGPA is calculated with SGPA of all semesters to two decimal points and is indicated in final grade in marks card/transcript showing grades of all 8 semesters and their courses/subjects.

CGPA reflects the failed status in case of fail till the course/s are passed.

Transcript Format

Based on the above recommendation on letter grades, grade points, SGPA and CGPA, the transcript shall be issued for each semester with a consolidated transcript indicating the performance on all semesters.
