"A candidate who has passed B.A. (Honours School) in Economics and/or M.A. (Honours School) in Economics examination from the Panjab University under the Semester System may reappear as a private candidate in a course/courses he/she wishes to, with a view to improving his/her performance as per the current syllabi/courses being offered. ITEM 23

Regulations for Diploma in Forensic Science & Criminology (Semester System) (effective from the session 2011-12)

- 1.1 The duration of the course for Diploma in Forensic Science & Criminology shall be one academic year comprising two semesters.
- 1.2 The examination for the course shall be held twice a year, ordinarily in the month of December for first Semester and April/May for Second Semester on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
- 1.3 The date of examination and the last date for receipt of admission form with requisite fee as fixed by the Syndicate, shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 1.4 The examination fee to be paid by a candidate shall be as prescribed by the Syndicate from time to time.
2. The minimum, qualification for admission to the course shall be:-
 - a) B.Sc. degree of the Panjab University,
OR
 - b) A Bachelor's Degree in any Stream or Discipline of the Panjab university provided the candidate has passed +2 examination under 10+2 system of education with Science of any equivalent examination,
OR
 - c) An examination of any other University recognized by the Syndicate as equivalent to (a) or (b) above.
3. A person who possesses the qualifications laid down in Regulation 2 shall be eligible to appear in the examination provided he produces the following certificates signed by the Head of the Department of Anthropology:-
 - a) of good character;
 - b) of having been on the rolls of the Department of Anthropology during the academic year preceding the examination; and
 - c) of having attended not less than 75 percent of the lectures in each paper delivered for the course in the theory and practicals/demonstrations.
4. A deficiency in the required number of lectures may be condoned:
 - a) Up to 10 percent of the total lectures delivered by the Head of the Department; and

- b) Up to 10 percent by the Dean of the University Instruction on recommendations of the Head of the Department.**
- 5. The examination shall be held in accordance with the prescribed syllabus.**

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ITEM 25

Regulations for Postgraduate Diploma in Yoga Therapy (Annual System) (effective from the session 2010-11)

1. The duration of the course leading to the Post Graduate Diploma in Yoga Therapy shall be one year and six month internship. The examination shall be held once in a year in the month of April/May or on such other dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.

Every candidate shall pay his/her examination fee at the time of admission to the course along with other charges, i.e. tuition fee etc. (as decided by the Syndicate from time to time).

2. A candidate who has obtained Bachelor's degree in any discipline/stream with at least 50% marks from P.U. or from any other University whose examination has been recognized as equivalent to the corresponding examination (Under 10+2+3 system of education) of this University shall be eligible to join the Diploma Course.

Provided that in case of candidates having Bachelor's degree of the University through modern Indian languages [Hindi/ Urdu/Punjabi (Gurmukhi Script)] and /or in a classical language (Sanskrit/Persian/ Arabic) or degree of any other University obtained in the same manner recognized by the Syndicate, 50% marks in the aggregate shall be calculated by taking into account full percentage of marks in all the papers in languages excluding the additional optional paper, English and the elective subject taken together.

3. The admission to the course will be on the basis of merit as per the decision of the University.
4. In the case of tie at any stage in the preparation of the merit list, the inter-se merit will be determined according to the following criteria:
 - (a) A candidate getting higher percentage of marks in the qualifying examination shall rank higher in order of merit.
 - (b) In case of a tie in marks in qualifying examination, a candidate senior in age shall be held higher in order of merit.
5. All the candidates whose names appear in the merit list shall have to appear for interview prior to the admission. In case candidates who do not appear for the interview will not be considered for admission. The candidates must produce all the relevant certificates in original for verification at the time of interview failing which they will not be considered for admission.

6. **The Head of the University Department/Principal of the College shall forward to the Controller of Examinations at least five weeks before the commencement of the examination for each semester a list of the students along with their admission forms and fees who have satisfied the requirements of regulations and are qualified to appear in the examination.**

Whenever the application or fee of the candidate is received more than three days after the last date prescribed above, he shall pay an additional fee as fixed by the Syndicate, provided that such application shall be entertained only up to three weeks before the commencement of the examination.

7. **Every candidate shall be examined in the subjects as laid down in the syllabus prescribed from time to time.**

Seminar, Project and Workshop will be assessed internally on 100% basis. Viva-Voce shall be conducted jointly by the internal and external examiners.

The Head of the University Department/ Principal of the College shall forward these marks on the basis of periodical tests, written assignment, case discussion, field trips etc., to the Controller of Examinations at least one week before the commencement of the examination.

8. **The Head of the University Department/Principal of the College will preserve the records on the basis of which the internal assessment awards have been prepared for inspection, if needed by the University, up to six months from the date of declaration of the results.**

Project reports shall be submitted to the Head of the University Department/Principal of the College at least 10 days before the commencement of the examination. Reports received after the prescribed date shall not be accepted.

9. **If a candidate fails in only one subject (theory) he is required to reappear in a paper, he will be given one more opportunity to qualify in that paper without attending a fresh course of lectures.**
10. **A deficiency upto 10 per cent lectures may be condoned by the Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the College.**

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ITEM 26

**Regulations for Advance Practical Training in Indian Classical Music
(effective from the session 2009-10)**

1. The duration of the course for Advance Practical Training in Indian Classical Music is one year.
2. The examination shall be held once a year ordinarily in the month of May, on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
3. A candidate who has passed M.A. in Music shall be eligible to join the course.
4. The dates of commencement of the examination and the last date for receipt of admission forms and fee without late fee and with late fee as fixed by the Syndicate from time to time and the same will be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
5. A person who possesses the qualifications laid down in Regulation 3 and produces the following certificates signed by the Chairman/Head of the University Department of Music shall be eligible to appear in the examination:-
 - (a) of good character;
 - (b) of having been on the rolls of the Department/College as the case may be during academic year preceding the examination; and
 - (c) of having attended not less than 75 per cent of the lectures in each paper deliver to the class.
6. Deficiency in the required number of lectures may be condoned:-
 - (i) Up to 10 per cent of the total lectures delivered by the Chairperson of the Department/Principal of the college as the case may be;
 - (ii) Up to additional 5 per cent of the total lectures delivered, by the Dean to tiv
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the examination as a private candidate, within a period of three years of completing the course.

8. The examination shall be held in accordance with the syllabus prescribed by the Academic Council.
9. There will be three practical lectures per day (total 15 lectures in a week).
10. The examination will be in the presence of audience as it is a practical oriented course.
11. The medium of examination shall be English/Hindi/Punjabi.
12. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be-
 - (i) 40 per cent in each theory paper;
 - (ii) 40 per cent in Oral; and
 - (iii) 45 per cent in the aggregate.
13. As soon as possible after the termination of the examination, the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of the candidates.
14. Successful candidates shall be classified as under:-
 - (a) Those who obtain 75 percent or more of the aggregate marks. : First Division with Distinction
 - (b) Those who obtain 60 percent or more but less than 75 percent of the aggregate marks. : First Division
 - (c) Those who obtain 50 per cent or more but less than 60 per cent of the aggregate marks. : Second Division
 - (d) Those who obtain less than 50% of the aggregate marks. : Third Division
15. Each successful candidate shall be awarded a Diploma showing the division in which he/she has passed.

5. **The Syllabi and course of reading for Bachelor of Clinical Optometry (B.Optom.) shall be approved by the Faculty of Medical Sciences from time to time.**
6. **Every candidate for Bachelor of Clinical Optometry (B.Optom.) shall send his/her application for final examinations of Part I, II & III through Chairperson/Head of the Department accompanied by the following certificates:**
 - (a) **of good character;**
 - (b) **of having attended at least 75% of the total number of lectures and practicals separately in each course; and**
 - (c) **of having passed the earlier examinations.**

The Director-Principal of the College is empowered to condone the shortage in attendance of lectures to the extent of 5% in each subject of theory and practical separately in special cases.

7. **The last dates by which examination forms and fees must reach the Controller of Examinations without or with late fee as prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.**
8. **The amount of the admission fee for each academic year to be paid by a candidate shall be as prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate from to time and there will be no tuition fee for the 4th year i.e. internship.**
9. **Examination in theory/practical shall be held at the end of 1st year (Part-I), 2nd year (Part-II) and 3rd year (Part-III) with two internal and two external examiners according to the scheme of examination approved by the Faculty of Medical Sciences.**
10. **The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.**
11. **There will be internal assessment of 10 marks each in theory & practical in each subject. Candidates are required to secure minimum 35% marks in theory & Practical separately for appearing in the final examination.**
12. **The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be–**
 - (A) **Theory examination**
 - (i) **Maximum marks for internal assessment = 10 marks**
 - (ii) **Maximum marks for final examination = 50 marks**

Total = 60 marks

Minimum marks required to declare as passed in theory including internal assessment= 30 marks (50%).

(B) Practical examination

- (i) Maximum marks for internal assessment = 10 marks**
- (ii) Maximum marks for final examination = 30 marks**
Total = 40 marks

Minimum marks required to declare as passed in theory including internal assessment= 20 marks (50%).

(C) A student will be deemed to have passed in the examination if he/she passed in each subject (Theory & Practical) separately.

13. A student shall be promoted to the next year subject to the following conditions:-

- (i) A candidate who is placed in compartment is eligible to join the next higher class provisionally.**
- (ii) The maximum number of compartments permitted should be only in two subjects out of four. If a candidate has compartment in more than two subjects he/she should be treated as fail.**

ITEM 28

Regulations for Postgraduate Diploma in Research Methodology & Statistics (effective from the session 2011-12)

1. The duration of the course for Postgraduate Diploma in Research Methodology & Statistics shall be one year comprising two semesters.
2. The examination will be held twice a year ordinarily in the months of December and May or on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
3. A person who has completed Post Graduation in any stream is eligible to apply for this course.
4. A student must have 75% attendance to qualify for the examinations. A deficiency of 15 lectures may be condoned by the Chairperson of the department and up 25 lectures by Dean of University Instruction.
5. A student to be successful in the examinations must have obtained 50% marks in each paper.
6. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.
7. A student who has failed in the examination or having completed the course has failed to appear in the examination may be allowed to appear as a late department student, without having to attend fresh course of lectures. This will be permitted only if there are no major changes in content of syllabi within four consecutive chances.
8. If a candidate has failed in examination, but has passed in practical examination his/her marks shall be carried forward at his/her discretion

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- 10. Successful candidates shall be classified as under:-**
- (i) Those who obtain 60% or more of : First Division the aggregate marks.**
 - (ii) Those who obtain 50% or more but : Second Division below 60% of the aggregate marks.**
- There is no third division in this course.**
- 11. Each successful candidate shall be awarded a Postgraduate Diploma by the University.**
- 12. A candidate who has qualified for the award of Post Graduate Diploma in Research Methodology and Statistics from Panjab University shall be allowed to reappear as a private candidate in paper/s in which he/she wants to improve previous performance. 3. The admission to the course shall be open to any person who has obtained the Bachelor's degree in any discipline or any other qualification recognised as equivalent by the Syndicate.
4. The medium of instruction shall be English only but medium of examination shall be English, Hindi or Punjabi.
