13 "A student, who having attended the prescribed number of lectures and practicals, does not appear in the examination or having appeared in the examination has failed in the examination but has obtained pass marks in the internal assessment, shall have the option to have his/her internal assessment marks carried forward for two subsequent years without attending the course afresh and shall be allowed to take the examination during this period as a late college student. After two years, he/she shall have to join the college as a regular student."

Regulations for M.Sc. Applied Chemistry (Pharmaceutical) (Semester System) (effective from the admission of 2008).

- 1. The duration of the course for the degree of M.Sc. in Applied Chemistry shall be two academic years (Four Semesters).
- 2. A person with the following qualification from the Panjab University or any other University/Institution recognized by the Panjab University shall be eligible to join the course;

- 8. A deficiency in the required number of lectures up to 5% in each paper may be condoned by the Board of Control.
- 9. The examination fee will be charged in the beginning of each semester along with other dues.
- 10. The medium of instruction and examination shall be English.
- 11 The minimum marks to pass the examination shall be 40% in each theory paper and internal assessment taken together, practical and vivavoce and sessionals based on the assessment of the regular lab/class work, research performance etc. separately.
- 12. The grace marks as per M.Sc. (HS) rules.
- 13. The result of the candidate shall be pass or reappear and the candidate may be allowed to reappear in that examination at the time of the next regular examination. Re-examination will be allowed in not more than one paper in each semester.
- 14. The successful candidates shall be classified as under:
 - a) Those who obtain 75% or more of the : First Division aggregate marks. with Distinction
 - b) Those who obtain 60% or more of the : First Division aggregate marks but less than 75%.
 - c) Those who obtain 50% or more of the : Second Division aggregate marks but less than 60%.
 - d) Those who obtain 40% or more of the : Third Division aggregate marks but less than 50%.
- 15. The result of the examination shall be published by the Controller of Examinations by compiling all the awards received during the tenure of the course.
- 16. Every successful candidate shall be awarded a degree indicating the marks in Theory and Practicals, separately and the distinction/Division in which he/she has passed.

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Regulations for M.Sc. (Forensic Science & Criminology) (Semester System) (effective from the admission of 2009).

- (i) The course comprises 4 semesters (2-Years). The first and the third semester shall be from July to December and the second from January to June, respectively or as decided by the Vice-Chancellor. The instructional period for each semester will extend over a period of at least 16 weeks followed by preparatory holidays for not more than one week prior to the semester examinations.
 - (ii) The final examination shall be conducted at the end of each semester in the courses offered in that semester only.
 - (iii) A student who does not appear for any reason or fails in paper/papers in any semester shall be eligible to take the examination(s) along with the respective examination(s) of the regular students of the next year batch. In no case, the University will hold special examination for such failed students.
- 2. Admission will be based on merit at graduation level with B.Sc./B.Sc. Honours degree in Forensic Science, or B.Sc./B.Sc. Honours Degree in any stream of Science of Panjab University or any other University recognized by Panjab University, with minimum 50% marks.
- 3. The fee for the admission will be charged as per the decision of the University from time to time.
- 4. The maximum student's intake shall be as per the decision of the University from time to time.
- 5. To be eligible to take the examination, a candidate has to attend prescribed minimum number of lectures in the respective paper/course as per the rules of the University.
- To qualify for the award to the Post-graduate degree of the Faculty of Science in Forensic Science & Criminology i.e. M.Sc. (Forensic Science & Criminology), a candidate has to successfully complete the course work. The The of

- 7. The normal workload of a student in a semester will be 20 credits each paper and each semester comprising 4 papers.
- 8. The maximum marks for final examination of each theory and Practical for paper shall be 80 and 40, respectively. The internal assessment for each theory and practical paper shall be 20 and 10 marks respectively. These shall be reflected in the final award sheet issued by the University after the semester examination.
- 9. The outlines of the tests, syllabi and courses of reading as approved by the University will be announced in advance.

- 20. The marks obtained in the internal assessment shall be shown to the students before commencement of final examination.
- 21. The paper setters and the evaluators shall be from the Panjabab

Regulations for M.Sc. Fashion Designing (Semester System) newly introduced in the affiliated colleges to Panjab University (effective from the session 2010).

1. The duration of the course for the degree of M.Sc. (Fashion Designing) shall be of two academic years. Under the semester system each academic year shall consist of two semesters i.e. July to November/December and December/January to the end of April. The first semester examination shall ordinarily be held in the month of November/December and the second semester in April/May on such

- of having attended not less than 75% of the lectures, practicals, seminars etc., separately in each paper during the semester.
- 9. The Principal of the College is empowered to condone shortage in attendance in lectures and practicals upto fifteen lectures in each of the subjects and seven periods in each of the practicals.
- 10. There shall be one House Examination in a semester followed by one Final Examination for that semester.
- 11. Internal Assessment will be based on criteria given below:

- 16. If a candidate is unable to appear in any of the mid-semester tests on Medical grounds, the Principal of the College may hold another test for the purpose of internal assessment.
- 17. A candidate on reappearing shall pay admission fee in each semester examination as prescribed for the admission concerned by the Syndicate from time to time and the admission fee for reappear would be in addition to the admission fee charged for other semester examination, if, any, in which he/she is appearing.
- 18. A candidate shall be deemed to have passed the examinations if he/she obtains:-
 - 40% in each written paper and practical examination separately.
 - 50% in internal assessment of each subject.
 - 45% in the aggregate of all the subjects including internal assessment.
 - 50% in the project/seminar.
- 19. Each candidate shall be required to have obtained pass marks in each course of theory and practical separately in each semester.
- 20. (i) A student will be allowed to reappear in a paper/s in two consecutive chances taking odd semester subjects in odd semester examinations in November/December and even semester subjects in even semester examinations in April/May.
 - (ii) In addition to the regular papers prescribed for the semesters a candidate appearing in a particular semester examination for the first time shall be allowed to appear in maximum of ten subjects of the lower semester/s.
 - (iii) A candidate who has failed to take the chance to appear or reappear in some of the subjects of the semesters of M.Sc. in Fashion Designing in terms of Regulations 20(i) and (ii) may appear as late student within two years of the exhaustion of his chances of reappear. If a candidate fails to pass the examination in this period his/her candidature will stand cancelled automatically.
- 21. The successful candidate shall be classified into three divisions as under:-
 - (i) Those who obtain 60% and more of the : First Division aggregate marks of all semester

examinations, taken together.

- (ii) Those who obtained 50% or more but less: Second Division than 60% of the aggregate marks of all semester examination, taken together.

(i)B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./ BCA or Honours (under 10+2+3) the Panjab University or any other University.

OR

(iii) B.A./B.Sc./B.Com./B.B.A./
B.C.A. or Hounours (under 10+2+3 system of education) and Diploma Approfondi de La Langue Francaise (DALF Advanced French Language Diploma) issue by the French National Ministry of Education.

Provided that:-

A Candidate shall apply for M.A. in French only if he has the knowledge of the language as clarified in 3.1 (i).

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Regulations for Postgraduate Diploma in Library Automation and Networking (PGDLAN) (Annual System) at University School of Open Learning (effective from the academic session 2009-10).

- 1. The duration of the course for the PGDLAN shall be one academic year.
- 2. The scheme of examination shall be Annual System.
- 3. The last date for the receipt of examination admission forms with and without late fee shall be fixed by the Syndic*ate/Senate from time to time.
- 4. The examination fee to be paid by the candidate shall be as prescribed by the Syndicate/Senate from time to time.
- 5. The admission to the course shall be open to any person who has passed Bachelor of Library Science (B.Lib.Sc.) from any recognized University.
- 6. Every student admitted to the PGDLAN course shall be on the rolls of the department and shall pay such fees to the University as the Syndicate may prescribe from time to time.
- 7. The examination shall be held in accordance with the syllabus prescribed by the Senate.
- 8. A candidate who has been on the rolls of the USOL and fails to appear or having appeared, fails in the examination, may be allowed to continue his/her enrolment for the period of two years immediately succeeding the year in which he/she completed the course on payment of continuation fee as prescribed by the Syndicate from time to time every year, in addition to the examination fee and to appear in the examination as an ex-student of the USOL.
- 9. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be:-
 - (i) 40% in each paper in the University examination and (ii) 50% in the aggregate.
- 10. Grace marks shall be given in accordance with the University Regulations.
- 11. For reappear cases, candidate should secure at least 50% marks in aggregate and 25% marks in the papers in which he/she has failed.

22. If a candidate fails in the internal assessment, he/she may be given one opportunity to improve his/her internal assessment.

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ITEM 15

Addition of Regulation 6 for B.A.LL.B. (Honours) 5-Year Integrated Course, (effective from the session 2005-06).

"If a student of 5-Year B.A.LL.B. (Honours) Integrated Course wishes to discontinue his/her studies, he/she be awarded the degree of B.A. after successful completion of the first three years of the course. However, if subsequently he/she completes all the 5 years, then he/she be awarded B.A.LL.B (Honours) degree on surrendering the first degree of B.A. provided that he/she must complete the course within eight years from the date of admission to the first semester of the course."

ITEM 16

Regulations for (a) Postgraduate Diploma in Advertising & Public Relations (b) Postgraduate Diploma in Hindi and Punjabi Journalism on account of introduction of Semester System in place of Annual System (effective from the session 2010-11).

- 1.1 The duration for Postgraduate Diploma in Advertising and Public Relations shall be one academic year.
- 1.2 This shall be part-time course and the classes will be held in the morning and/or evening.
- 1.3 The examination shall ordinarily be held annually in the month of April/May or on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate, and in the month of November/December, or on such dates as may be fixed by the Syndicate.
- 1.4 The last date for receipt of admission forms with and without late fee fixed by the Syndicate/Senate shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- 1.5 The date of examination as fixed by the Syndicate shall be published by the Controller of Examinations.
- 2.1 Admission to the course shall be made on the basis of an entrance test, according to the rules prescribed by the University.

- 8.1 The minimum marks required to pass the PG Diploma in Advertising and Public Relations examination shall be 40% in each paper and 50% in the aggregate.
- 8.2 Successful candidates who obtain 60% of the marks or more in the aggregate shall be placed in the first division and all others in the second division.
- 8.3 A candidate who obtains 50% of the aggregate marks but fails in one paper only, obtaining not less than 25% of the marks in the paper, shall be allowed to clear the compartment paper within three consecutive examinations from the date of his first failing in that paper, to be deemed to have passed the examination.
- 8.4 Four weeks after the termination of the examination or as soon thereafter as possible, the Controller of Examinations shall publish the result of the examination.
- 8.5 Each successful candidate shall be awarded a Diploma stating the division in which he/she passed.
- 9. The Board of Control of the School of Communication Studies and the Board of Studies in School of Communication Studies up or as soon thereafter

- (b) Regulations for Postgraduate Diploma in Hindi and Punjabi Journalism (effective from the academic session 2010-11).
- 1.1 The duration for the Postgraduate Diploma in Hindi and Punjabi Journalism shall be one academic year.

- 2.2 Eligibility for PG Diploma in Hindi Journalism

A candidate who:

(a) is a graduate shall be eligible to join the PG Diploma in Hindi Journalism.

OR

- (b) possesses a qualification of another University recognized as equivalent to (a) shall be eligible to join the PG Diploma in Hindi Journalism.
- 2.3 Eligibility for PG Diploma in Punjabi Journalism

A candidate who:

(a) is a graduate shall be eligible to join the PG Diploma in Punjabi Journalism.

OR

(b) possesses a qualification of another University recognized as equivalent to (a) shall be eligible to join the PG Diploma in Punjabi Journalism.

- 3. The examination shall be open to a student who:
 - (i) has been on the rolls of the University's PG Diploma course in Hindi and Punjabi journalism during the academic year preceding the examination.
