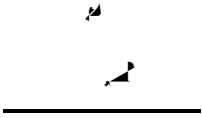

Students are expected to familiarize themselves with the points elaborated in the syllabus. A preferred mode of teaching at least two lectures introducing the unit plus at least six periods of discussion in which students make brief presentations on the basis of the readings.

Paper II will be of marks for theory examination and marks for internal assessment. There will be questions in a paper. The candidate will be required to attempt questions.

Question No. will be compulsory and carry marks. It will consist of short questions spread over the entire syllabus. The candidate is required to attempt any 10 out of 12. Each short question carry marks. Answers will be answered in words.

Reading part of the question paper will be divided into four units corresponding to the four units of the syllabus. The paper setter will set Essay type questions from each unit. The candidate will attempt essay type questions. One of the questions. Each question will carry marks.

The paper setter is expected to follow the Recommended Readings and set questions on the subjects or parts of a theme rather than the topic as a whole.
