Subject: Basic Knowledge of Yoga in Bhagavad-Gita

Objectives:

- 1. To enable the students to know about the nature of the Sanskrit language and how it is fundamental to understand the ancient Indian culture.
- 2. To enable the students to know about the traditional basic nature of Yoga.
- 3. To provide detailed knowledge about the types and basic concepts of Yoga in Bhagavad-Gita.
- 4. To enable the students to have hands on experience in making assignment record file carrying 20 marks.

Instructions for the Paper Setters:

- Eleven questions in all shall be set. (Maximum Marks: 60+20= 80)
- TEN questions shall be set selecting at least two questions from each unit from I to V and the nature of the answers should be essay type.
- The students shall be required to attempt at least ONE question from each unit from I to V. Each question shall carry 12 marks.(5x12=60 maximum marks for FIVE questions)
- Eleventh question shall be compulsory. It shall have FIVE brief questions, for 04 marks each, selecting one each from each unit and the answers should be limited to the maximum word limit of 75 words each. (5x4=20 maximum marks for short answered questions)
- Bellow 40% score shall be considered not qualified.
